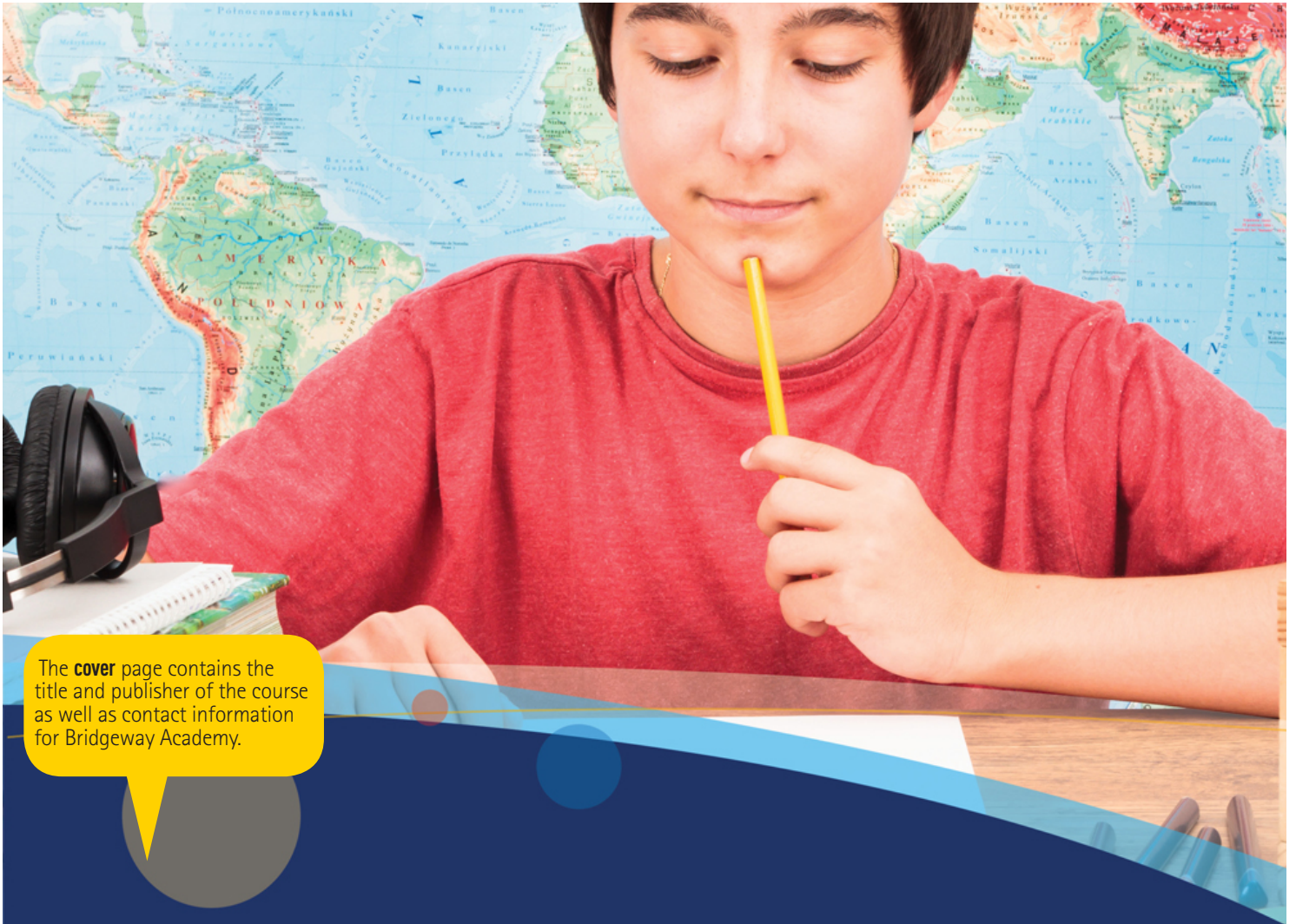

COURSE DESCRIPTION
